EMAB Meeting Summary – June 11-12'24

Meeting held in-person and by teleconference/videoconference

Minutes/Action Item Follow-up

- Need to revise Community Update costs for all communities.
- All Board members to sign EMAB Code of Conduct if they haven't already.
- Concerns about yellow haze at mine.

Finance

- Discussion on whether EMAB should start paying people to attend Community
 Updates tabled to future meeting. ED to check with communities.
- ED's spending authority increased to \$25k
- Finalize comments on Jack Kaniak Environmental Scholarship
- Approve wildlife standing offer to Roam Ecology

Environmental Air Quality Monitoring and Management Plan (EAQMMP) Update

- Laura Malone from GNWT provided update to Board; GNWT will be meeting with DDMI at on-site on June 24-25. DDMI must respond to Minister's Report on investigation of whether Diavik's Air Quality Monitoring Program is adequate.
- DDMI is still resistant to adopting the recommendations in the Minister's report, but are willing to work with GNWT to come to a resolution.
- DDMI installing Scentinal air monitor to measure total suspended particulates, nitrogen oxides, and sulfur oxides.
- EMAB to follow up with Minister re: yellow haze monitoring.

Jan 16'24 Fuel Spill

- Board to go to site of fuel spill on June 13 site visit and inform Diavik of any concerns.
- EMAB to also ask DDMI:
 - if any other fuel storage areas on site are not lined and bermed.
 - o how it will ensure another fuel spill like this doesn't happen again.
 - o to receive a copy of Final Remediation Plan.

Planning for two-year budget submission

- EMAB to decide what should be in next budget, and ED will draft.
- Draft budget to be submitted to DDMI by end of September 2024.

Traditional Knowledge Fish Camp

- Board approves draft follow-up letter to DDMI re: heavy metal cleanses.
- Environmental Specialist will attend 2024 fish camp.
- Should count number of parasites in each fish.

Traditional Knowledge Working Group Discussion

- Joanne Barnaby and Natasha Thorpe of Thorpe Consulting recommend that past TK Panel recommendations should be used to inform TK Closure Monitoring Plan; should also look at existing programs in communities to inform Plan.
- EMAB to investigate mines with similar programs for lessons learned.
- Have initial Plan ready before closure (March 2026). Then expand over time phased approach.
- Recommend that if EMAB takes on the TK WG to develop, that EMAB hire a dedicated TK Coordinator rather than hire a consultant.
- EMAB to draft letter to Diavik outlining Board is willing to take on the TK WG but only under certain conditions (adequate resources, budget, and personnel, etc.).

Meeting with DDMI COO Matthew Breen

- Matthew Breen arrived with DDMI colleagues Gaeleen Macpherson, Laura Worsley-Brown, and Garrett Hinchey.
- DDMI wants to listen to EMAB and work together respectfully as partners.
- DDMI considering appointing Board representative in near future; all official correspondence to go to Matthew Breen in the meantime; DDMI also open to attending meetings as needed.
- Matt notes final Remediation Plan for Jan 16'24 fuel spill has been submitted, and that the weather is warm enough for mine heaters to be turned off and further clean-up to continue.

Board Member Update and Community Concerns

Board members provided community updates; no major concerns.
